வோல்பிரக்ட் நாகெஜல் [Volbrecht Nagel] (1867 - 1921)

வி. நாகெஜல் முதன் முதல் ஜெர்மனியிலிருந்து கேரள மாநிலத்திற்கு வந்து சுவிசேஷ மற்றும் மனித மேம்பாட்டு ஊழியங்களைச் செய்தவர் என்ற பெருமைக்குரியவர்

பிறப்பும் இளமையும்:

வி.நாகெஜல் 1867 ஆம் ஆண்டு நவம்பர் மாதம் மூன்றாம் தேதி கெமினிர்ச் பீட்டர் நாகெஜலுக்கும் எலிசபெத்துக்கும் ஜெர்மனியில் உள்ள ஸ்டாம்ஹெயிம் என்ற இடத்தில் பிறந்தார். இளவயதிலேயே பெற்றோரை இழந்தார். பின்னர் திரு.பின்டிவால்டு என்பவரது ஆதரவில் வளர்ந்து கல்வி கற்றார்.



வி.நாகெஜலின் மனமாற்றம்

நாகெஜல் தனக்கு 18 வயது இருக்கும்போது ஒருநாள் செருப்புத்தைக்கும் ஒருவர் மூலமாக சுவிசேஷத்தைக் கேட்டார். அந்நேரமே இயேசு கிறிஸ்துவை தனது சொந்த இரட்சகராக ஏற்றுக்கொண்டார். அதன் பின்னர் சவிட்ஸர்லாந்து சென்று அங்குள்ள வேதாகம கல்லூரி ஒன்றில் வேதபாடங்களைக் கற்றார். அதன்பின்னர் 1886 ஆம் ஆண்டு ஜெர்மனியில் உள்ள பாசல் (Basel) ஊழிய ஸ்தாபனத்தில் இணைந்தார்

கேரளாவில் மிஷனரி ஊழியம்

1893 ஆம் ஆண்டு பாசல் மிஷனரியாக கேரளா வந்தார் அவர் முதலாவது கன்னூர் என்ற இடத்தில் மிஷனரி பணியை நிறைவேற்றி வந்தார். அப்போது அவர் பாசல் மிஷனுடன் தனக்கிருந்த தொடர்பை துண்டித்தார். இதனால் சொந்த நாட்டிலிருந்து கிடைக்கும் உதவிகள் அவருக்கு கிடைக்கவில்லை. இருப்பினும் அவர் கிறிஸ்துவின் மீதுள்ள தனது விசுவாசத்தை விட்டுவிடவில்லை. தேவன் மீது தான் வைத்திரிக்கிற விசுவாசம் தன்னுடைய எதிர்காலத்தை நடத்த போதுமானது என்று அவர் நம்பினார்.

கேரளாவில் அவர் இருந்தபோது மலையாளம் மொழியை அதிவிரைவாக கற்று அதில் நிபுணரானார். மலையாள மொழியைக் கற்றதோடு மட்டுமல்லாமல் மலையாளத்தில் பல கீர்த்தனைப் பாடல்களையும் எழுதினார். அவருடைய பாடல்கள் இன்றும் பாடுகிறவர்களைப் பரவசமடைதச் செய்கிறது. தேவ கிருபையால் பல நண்பர்களையும், குடும்பங்களையும் பெற்றார். சத்தியார்த்தி என்ற விசுவாசி நாகெஜலுக்கு உதவியாக ஊழியத்தில் இருந்தார்.

இருவரும் மாட்டு வண்டியில் சென்று கேரளாவின் பகுதிகளில் கிறிஸ்துவின் சுவீசேஷ ஊழியத்தை செய்தனர். நாஜெல் ஆங்கிலேய-இந்திய ஆசிரியராகிய இருந்த ஹாரியட் மிச்சல் என்பவரை திருமணம் செய்துகொண்டார்.

நாஜெல் தொடர்ந்து தன் நண்பர் சத்தியார்த்தியுடன் சென்று வாணியம்குளம், குன்னம்குளம் போன்ற பகுதிகளுக்குச் சென்று ஊழியம் செய்து வந்தார். இதன் மூலம் குன்னம்குளம் பகுதிகளில் பல திருச்சபைகளை நிறுவினார்.

பின்னர் அவர் பாராலூரில் சிறைச்சாலை ஊழியத்தையும் செய்தார். அதன் மூலமாக அநேக சிறைக்கைதிகள் மனமாற்றமடைந்து கிறிஸ்துவுக்கு நேராக தங்கள் வாழ்க்கையை ஒப்புக்கொடுத்தனர். அதனைத் தொடர்ந்து நெல்லிக்குன்னு, திருச்சூர் போன்ற பகுதிகளுக்குச் சென்று கிறிஸ்துவின் சுவீசேஷத்தை அறிவித்தார். சுவீசேஷம் அறிவித்தல், சபை நிறுவதல் போன்ற பணிகள் மட்டுமல்லாது அப்பகுதிகளில் அநாதைப் பெண் பிள்ளைகளுக்கான கருணை இல்லத்தையும் நிறுவினார். இந்த அநாதை இல்லத்தின் மூலமாக வெளிப்பட்ட கிறிஸ்தவ அன்பும் பராமரிப்பும் இனறும் அநேகரை பராமரிக்கிறது.

நாஜெலின் படைப்புகள்

நாஜெல் இளவயதிலிருக்கும்போதே ஜெர்மன் மொழியில் பல பாடல்களை இயற்றிப் பாடியுள்ளார். அவர் ஆங்கில பாமாலைகளை ஞாபகப்படுத்தி, மலையாளத்தில் எவ்வித மாற்றமுமின்றி மொழியாக்கம் செய்தார். நாஜெல் ஏறக்குறைய நூறு மலையாளப் பாடல்களை இயற்றியுள்ளார்.

இறுதி நாட்கள்

1914 ஆம் ஆண்டு தனது 47 ஆம் வயதில் நாஜெல் தன்னுடைய இரண்டு குழந்தைகளோடு ஜெர்மனி சென்றார். ஆறு மாத த் திற்குள் இந்தியா திரும்ப வேண்டும் என்ற எண்ணத்துடன் சென்றார். ஆனால் முதல் உலகப்போர் வெடித்ததால் அவரது இந்தியப் பயண ஆசை தடைப்பட்டது. அந்த நாட்களில் அவர் நரம்புத்தளர்ச்சி என்ற வியாதியால் பாதிக்கப்பட்டு படுத்த படுக்கைக்குள்ளானார். நாஜெல் தனது 54 ஆம் வயதில் 1921 ஆம் ஆண்டு மே மாதம் 21 ஆம் தேதி அன்று பரம பிதாவிடம் சென்றார். அவருடைய உடல் விட்னஸ்டில், வேதாகமப் பள்ளியில் உள்ள கல்லறைத் தோட்டத்தில் நல்லடக்கம் செய்யப்பட்டது

Missionary Story

Lillian Trasher (1887 - 1961)

Lillian Trasher served as a Christian missionary in Assiout, Egypt, where she founded the country's first orphanage. Over a period of 50 years, about 10,000 children were raised in her home. Because of her contributions she earned the name 'Nile Mother of Egypt'.

The Beginning:

Lillian Trasher was born on September 27, 1887 in Florida, USA into a Catholic family. She made her personal commitment to Christ when she was a teen. One day, as a young girl, she knelt by a log in the woods and prayed, "Lord, if ever I can do anything for you, just let me know and I'll do it."

At the age of 17, while on a trip to Atlanta to apply for a job, she met Miss Mattie Perry who ran the Faith orphanage in North Carolina. By the end of the brief meeting, Miss Perry invited Lillian to work with her. The Faith Orphanage was a training ground for her. Not only did she learn the necessary skills such as cooking and caring for children, she also learned about the administration of a large home and what it meant to live by faith. For the next 5 years Lillian worked on and off at the orphanage, briefly attended a Bible School, pastored a church in Georgia and did evangelistic work in Kentucky.



In June of 1910, she accompanied Miss Perry to hear a missionary from India. At that service she sensed God telling her *now* was the time to get involved in missions. Knowing little about where she was to go, she gathered her few possessions and a few dollars and went to a missionary convention in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. While on that trip, she met G.S. Brelsford, a pastor who had worked in Assiout, Egypt. Initially reluctant to encourage her, the pastor eventually invited her to join his team when he returned. In the fall of 1910 Lillian and her sister, Jennie set sail to Egypt.

Ministry in Egypt :

Lillian and Jennie arrived in Assiout, Egypt (370 kms south of Cairo) in 1910 with less than \$100. Within a few months, a dying woman gave her sick baby to Lillian. To care for her and others like her, she along with Jennie rented a house and here began her ministry of caring for the children of Assiout. She travelled by donkey throughout the region pleading for money as she had no means of support. The local farmers would give her food and supplies for the orphanage. She even became known as the 'lady on a donkey'.

In 1914 she became affiliated with the new movement, the Assemblies of God. By this time, she had set up a school and Bible study program for the eight orphans in her care.

Lillian and Jennie returned to the States briefly in 1919 as the British expelled foreigners from Egypt during the post-World War I civil unrest, which included an attack on the orphanage. In the United States, Lillian went on a speaking tour of Assemblies of God churches, raising significant funds for the orphanage.

In spring of 1920, Lillian returned back to Egypt and expanded her mission to include widows and the blind. By 1921, she cared for 150 orphans and, by 1924, 300 children. She shared the Christian message wherever she traveled and kept the faith even during the extremely tough years of the Great Depression.

In 1927 she witnessed the spiritual harvest she had long prayed for – many of the children were saved and started praying and worshipping together

Early Letter from Lillian :

A 1936 letter from Lillian gives us a glimpse of the way in which our Heavenly Father provided for the 700 children she had at that time in her orphanage. Here are some excerpts from her letter:

“We are still looking to the Lord for our hourly needs. He is a wonderful caretaker! About 2 weeks ago I was rushing out early for an appointment when one of our boys, who is in-charge of the meals, stopped me, saying, ‘Mama, what is the orphanage to have for dinner.’ I said, ‘Fize, I haven’t one cent and I have to hurry out now.’ Soon I was attracted by a man waving an umbrella; he came toward me, took out his wallet and handed me \$50, saying that someone who did not wish to reveal his identity had sent it to me to buy food for the children. Fize was soon on his way to town for supplies. That day I was invited out for dinner where the subject of God’s care for His children came up. Someone mentioned how the Lord had provided for the orphanage that day. A rich young man at that dinner heard the story and gave me \$50.”

“Yesterday we were without any money for bread and the mail brought us only \$5. I was very busy taking care of a very ill baby, so I cried out, ‘Oh, Lord, surely you would not have me leave this sick child to go out to try to find bread for the children. I’ll take care of the baby, and you please send in the food.’ I called the post office to see if there might be something more and received word that they had a money order for me for \$40. It had come from South Africa.”

“Last Sunday we had no money for bread. I went to visit a lady who had been ill. She gave me \$25 to buy beef for the children’s dinner and \$25 for anything else. The next day I was again without money. We were out of soap, sugar and flour. Our flour costs \$560 a month. That day a stranger handed me \$25 and a friend handed me \$5, so I was able to get all I needed for that time.”

“Twenty-five years ago I arrived in Egypt and He has never failed me all these years. We are being fed like the sparrows which have neither barns nor storerooms.”

A Wartime Miracle :

It was September 1941. World War II was raging. They were not in danger of the fighting, but the war caused extreme shortages. It had cut off the mail which brought money from friends around the world. At that time “Mama Lillian” as she was now called, cared for 900 orphans, 80 widows, plus staff members and some refugees she had taken in. She had rationed food for days trying to make it last as long as possible. Not only were the children hungry, but their clothing was in tatters. In desperation Mama did what she had done in every crisis. She called a prayer meeting on a Monday. The note she passed around read: “The children can pray as long and as hard as the Lord puts it on them. We have nothing. The need is very great indeed, but our

“...I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet...Thou gavest me no kiss...My head with oil thou didst not anoint...” (Luke 7:44-46).

Our Lord expects much from us, as in the verse above where just opening the house was not enough. Similarly, there can be various ways in which one can involve in missions. Prayer and money, undoubtedly very important, can be done within the confines of a room. Preaching the gospel, sharing our love with all though, many times requires us to move out of our comfort zones. We want to praise God for all the mission activities through our Church in the Christmas season, all with the grace and leading of our Lord Almighty, were a blessing to many.

In Whitefield, an evening open air Christmas program was organized. Many new children, parents of the children who attend Sunday School came and people living nearby could also witness the play, songs, message and prayers. The highlight of the program was the nativity scene enacted by the Children.

In Priyanka Nagar, with the help of Come Ministries, Christmas programs could be held in many places simultaneously, covering young children, teens, women, men. Gospel meetings were held at 8 different locations in Priyanka Nagar, God helped us to share the Gospel to about 200 adults and 130 children.

Partnering with IEM, we could spend time in the Irula mission field an evening. Our pastor led the event, taking the gospel to many children through a puppet show, songs, prayer and message. We thank God for the resources He gave us in this season to do these ministries and for the church members who were a part of it.

As we look forward to 2015, among many requests for missions, a few for the congregation to pray and act would be,

1. More Faith: Just as our Church was formed with Sunday school as a starting point, God will do great things in the many places He is taking us to. Let us therefore not despise small beginnings (Zechariah 4:10) but have faith that will move mountains (Matthew 17:20).

2. More Discernment: God has warned us that even the very elect can be deceived through false Christs, false prophets with great signs and wonders (Matthew 24:24). There always have been people, sacrifices and ministries, not at all approved by God (Genesis 4:5, Matthew 25:41-46). May God help us to clearly identify His servants with whom we should work, what we need to say, do (Matthew 10:16-20).

3. More Workers: Both in the Old (Exodus 18:13-26) and New Testaments (Luke 10:2), our Lord shows that all need to be involved to build God's kingdom. May God show us where our calling is and partner with those departments of our Church. Individuals and families should prayerfully come forward and take ownership of the various ministries of the Church. Let us also uphold families like Mala aunty's, Mrs. Reena, Mr. Ruban Gandhi, who are helping God's work to be carried out in their neighborhood.

4. More Churches: God has blessed us with a wonderful Church and our response to that should always be like that of David (2 Samuel 7:2). Please pray for the right decision to be taken in Whitefield, where there is a congregation ready and if it is God's will that a Church be formed there and similarly in other places as well.

God is greater. 'Ask and it shall be given.' Lillian."

The next day the prayers continued. Wednesday morning, Mama Lillian received an urgent appeal to come to Cairo and meet with the American ambassador. She arrived in Cairo on Thursday morning. The ambassador had startling news! A Red Cross ship, loaded with relief supplies for Greek refugees, had turned back and come into the port at Alexandria, Egypt. Its cargo included thousands of dresses and huge sacks of powdered milk, rice, flour and other essential supplies.

"Could you use any of these things?" the ambassador asked Lillian. After lunch the ambassador took her to the docks. Crates and boxes were lined up on the sand as far as she could see. A convoy of trucks was loaded with food and other urgently needed supplies. More was being loaded on a train.

On Saturday when the supplies reached the orphanage every box and crate held answers to their prayers. That night, for the first time in days, the children could eat all they wanted. They slept on new bedding. On Sunday every child went to church wearing sparkling new clothes.

Today :

The Lillian Trasher Orphanage has provided a loving home, hope and Christian training to more than 25,000 children during these past 100 years. Today it is one of the largest and finest orphanages in the world.

Pakistan: Key Facts

Pakistan is officially called the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and is a sovereign country in South Asia. Pakistan has been characterized by periods of military rule, political instability and conflicts with neighbouring India. The country faces challenging problems including overpopulation, terrorism, poverty, illiteracy, and corruption. Its government and military leaders struggle to control domestic insurgents, many of whom are located in the tribal areas adjacent to Afghanistan. Pakistan has the third largest population of Muslims in the world, behind Indonesia and India. The country suffers from chronic sectarian and religiously motivated violence. Though the constitution guarantees religious freedom, Christians increasingly suffer under Pakistan's blasphemy laws. Many churches get vandalised and Christians are raped and abducted. Islam is practiced by 95-98% of the population and Christianity forms 2-5% of its population.

The touch was not the touch of flesh but something very different, like a feather touch. I was filled with awe and humility and I prayed to God, "Lord, I am not a worthy or holy person, but because of your love, you touched me and saved me from the sting of the scorpion."

Yes, there are many more of such instances of protection and care that our God give us which we are often not able to see and sense, but still God is with us every moment of our life. I thank God Almighty who protects and guides me in various aspects of my life.

Understanding and building self-esteem

Good self-esteem is *seeing yourself as God sees you*, no more and no less. The Bible affirms that each of us is of great significance and worth to God. We are created in His image, the objects of His love, and we must learn to value and love ourselves as God values and loves us. When we discover that we are objects of God's unconditional love, we cannot feel worthless. When we discover our true identity in Christ, we can start living as children of God and learn to be who we are and become what God wants us to become. Developing a healthy self-esteem is not the most important goal in life – *knowing Christ is*. Our self-concept has two sides, what we *think* about ourselves (self-image) and what we *feel* about ourselves (self-esteem).

Life is a journey towards maturity and becoming a whole and mature person does not happen automatically. It involves personal effort and growth, intellectually, emotionally and spiritually. This is sometimes painful but always rewarding. Growth to wholeness includes the development of healthy self-esteem. Good self-esteem, or alternatively the lack of it, gives a person either a springboard or a handicap for facing life.

Learning to grow in our self-esteem is a challenge. Each of us has been hurt and damaged in various ways in our childhood, sometimes through the ignorance of well-intentioned people and sometimes through circumstances outside our control. We have also made wrong choices which could affect us for the rest of our lives. God's image in us has been marred by sin, but it has not been lost. *Jesus came to make people whole again*. The only thing we all take with us when we die is the person we have become. Human parents would not want their children to remain infants, however delightful they may be. Also, to insist on doing everything for our children would result in their arrested growth. In the same way, God does not do all the work for us in our journey to wholeness. To do so would keep us immature. Our growth in self-esteem involves our participation as well as the operation of God's grace.

It is NOT true that because we have sinned, therefore we are worthless. We are *unworthy but not worthless*, and there is a big difference between the two. While we do not deserve God's love and favour, we are the recipients of it. We are of such great worth to God that He sent his Son to die for us, and it is preposterous to suggest that Jesus would die for someone who is worthless. God's love for us is unconditional and does not depend on our perfection or goodness but on His perfection and His goodness.

People with good self-esteem can forget about themselves and reach out to others with genuine love and concern. They do not need to prove anything; they know who they are. They do not have to try to fill their emptiness with achievement or material possessions. When they achieve something, it is because they believe in what they are doing, not because they are trying to establish their own worth by what they do. They *use things and love people*. They are concerned with *being rather than doing*. Their feelings of self-worth gives them confidence to face life knowing they are capable and lovable, and consequently they are at peace with themselves and with those around them. They find satisfaction in simple everyday pleasures and can enjoy their own company. Times of aloneness and silence can be very precious, providing opportunity for reflection and to listen to God.

On the other hand, people with low self-esteem carry around a constant pain inside which produces a self-preoccupation. This makes it difficult for them to forget about themselves. Many people live lives of quiet desperation. They often seek success or material possessions as a means of establishing their identity and worth. They tend to *love things and use people*, and find it difficult to form deep relationships. Pleasure-seeking, substance-abuse, a constant search for distraction and workaholism are common substitutes for the missing sense of self-worth. A lack of self-esteem makes people want to withdraw from others. They are concerned with *doing rather than being*. When people do not really like themselves, being alone can be very threatening and they will usually try to fill the silence by turning on the TV or finding some other form of escape.

No matter what our past or our situations, God enables us all to grow into His likeness as we dwell in Him and absorb the truth of the Word of God and bask in God's all-embracing love. This process seldom happens instantaneously and may take a long time. That is why God took the trouble to write a lengthy love-letter to us. Just as a lover reads and re-reads a letter from his or her beloved to absorb the message, so we need to do this with the Scriptures everyday of our lives. When we thus order our lives and make a decision to **not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, we will be transformed by the renewing of our minds (Rom 12:2) and we can become more than conquerors through him who loved us (Rom 8:37).**
